It helps the staff be better prepared for whom they are teaching when school begins. It also helps the parents who follow the paperwork and payment deadlines set up in the registration packet have a more enjoyable school year. Parents who have taken care of their children's registration fees, (curriculum, supply, locker, basketball, Junior Patriots, ladies' volleyball, and graduation fees) before school starts, will only have their child's tuition fees during the year to care for. Curriculum Fee

\$100 first semester payment due August 1st | \$100 second semester payment due January 1st

If paid after August 1st \$24.00 per month per student will be billed with tuition for a 10-month period for a total of \$240.00 per year. (Teachers may ask that you purchase additional materials for reading, art, etc.)

Elementary Supply Fee

\$20.00 per year, per student K4—6th grade (There are no second, third, or fourth child discounts.) This fee covers all basic supplies such as paper, pencils, pens, crayons or color pencils, a notebook, and pencil box. Parents maybe be asked to purchase additional supplies for subjects like Art.

Locker Fees

All junior high and high school students are required to either purchase a locker for the price of \$80, or they may rent a locker which they will share with a student for \$40 per year. Those who decide to purchase a locker may have the use of the locker as long as they are enrolled in school.

TUITION

You may pay your tuition as one yearly payment and take advantage of the 8% discount, or you may make ten monthly payments (beginning August 1, 2024 to May 1, 2025). The monthly tuition is due on the first of each month and if the bill is not paid before sixteenth of the month a late fee of \$25 will be charged. In addition to the late fee, if the student's bill is not paid by the first of the following month he will not be allowed to attend class regardless of the amount owed. No refunds of tuition, curriculum, or registration fees will be made for any reason including leaving school nor will you get to take your child's books.

Returned Check Fee

A \$25 charge will be added to account if a check is returned from a financial institution. After two checks have been returned to the school, payments must be made by cash, money order, cashier's check, or credit card.

Extended Absences

During the school year, if your student misses school there will not be any prorated tuition payments. There is no reduction of payments regardless of how many days the student actually attended class.

NEEDS SHOTS

WHY YOUR CHILD The California School Immunization Law requires that children be up-to-date on their immunizations (shots) to attend school or child care. Diseases like chickenpox, measles, and whooping cough spread quickly, so children need to be protected before they enter. Most children need booster shots before starting kindergarten. 7th grade entry requirements went into effect July 1, 1999. A varicella (chickenpox) requirement for kindergarten entry and child care attendance went into effect July 1, 2001.

WHAT YOU WILL **NEED AT** REGISTRATION

You will need your child's Immunization Record. It must show the date your child was given each required shot. If you do not have an Immunization Record or your child has not received all required shots, call your doctor or local health department now for an appointment.

- a This number includes kindergarten boosters. If your child is 4-6 years old, entry requirements are met with only 3 polio and 4 DTPs if at least one polio and one DTP dose were after your child's fourth birthday.
- ^b For children 7–17 years old, entry requirements are met with only 3 polio and 3 DTP or DT/Td if at least one polio and DTP or DT/Td were after your child's 2nd birthday. For students age 7 years and older, pertussis immunization is not required.
- c A Td booster is recommended but not required.
- d One dose must be on or after the 1st birthday regardless of any doses received earlier. The Hib requirement applies only to child care children under age 4 years and 6 months.
- e One dose on or after the first birthday is required for grades 1–6 and 8–12. Mumps immunization is not required for students age 7 vears and older.
- Two doses of the 2-dose hepatitis B vaccine formulation along with provider documentation that the 2-dose hepatitis B vaccine formulation was used for both doses and both doses were received at age 11-15 years will also fulfill this requirement.
- ⁸ If your child had chickenpox disease, ask your doctor to note it on the immunization record to meet the requirement.
- h Required for children not enrolled in California schools before July 1, 2001. 1 dose required for grades K-12. For children 13-17 years old, 2 doses are needed if vaccine received after 13th birthday.

If your child's record is missing some doses, please contact your doctor or clinic now to obtain the full immunization record or any doses needed. If your child recently received immunizations and needs an immunization later in the year, he/she can be allowed to attend, provided you get the remaining doses when they become due.

Your child may be exempted from some or all immunizations by a doctor because of a medical condition. Your child may be exempted by you because of your personal or religious beliefs. Ask your school or child care provider for details.

STUDENTS ENTERING FIRST GRADE

Proof of immunization is required at the time of registration. Students may not complete registration without it.

Physical Examination

The Child Health and Disability Prevention (CHDP) Program was created based on a law passed by the California State Legislature to promote the health of children and youth in California. The law states that parents are responsible to see that their children receive a health examination, regardless of income, within 18 months prior to first grade entry or 90 days thereafter. Furthermore, the parent must present proof to the school that the child received a health examination within this time period.

One out of every ten children entering first grade has a health problem unknown to the parent. When your child is examined, you will be given an explanation of the results. If treatment is recommended, you will be referred to an appropriate physician.

We urge you to ask the physician to share with us any health problems which might affect your child's ability to learn or participate in physical activities. We have enclosed the form (REPORT OF HEALTH EXAMINATION FOR SCHOOL ENTRY - PM171A) that needs to be completed by your doctor. Bring this signed form into the school office after your child has been examined.

If you have any questions regarding this physical for your child, please call the school office at (562) 426-5214. It is much easier to get an appointment for your child during the summer months. Please do not wait until the last moment to schedule your child's appointment. Your child can not start school unless this examination is completed and the form is turned in to the school office.

PLEASE NOTE: If your child has already had the physical during K5 and the form has been turned in to the office, please advise the school office and disregard this letter.

STUDENTS ENTERING SEVENTH GRADE

Proof of immunization is required at the time of registration. Students may not complete registration without it.

All Students entering, advancing, or transferring into the 7th Grade need proof of an adolescent whooping cough booster immunization before the start of school.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING DRESS CODE

Please note that students that are in violation of dress code that cannot be rectified at the school must be picked up with ½ hour of notification from school. Please remember that the longer it takes for the problem to be rectified the less school work our child will be able to complete that day.

K4-6th Grade
