## Lesson 9 David

#### I. DAVID'S YOUTH.

- 1. The word "David" means "beloved."
- 2. He was the son of Jesse and the second king of Israel.
- 3. <u>He was reared in Bethlehem and was the youngest of eight brothers</u>. See I Samuel 16:10-11 and Samuel 17:12-14.
- 4. He had a godly mother. Read Psalm 86:16; 116:16.
- 5. He was ruddy and handsome. Notice I Samuel 16:12.
- 6. He was called "the sweet psalmist of Israel." See II Samuel 23:1.
- 7. He was courageous in the slaying of both a lion and a bear. Review I Samuel 17:34-36.
- 8. He possessed musical gifts; he was a harpist; and he composed psalms.

## II. <u>DAVID, THE</u> KING.

- 1. <u>Saul, who was David's predecessor, was advised by his attendants to employ a harpist to soothe him with music when he was in periods of melancholy and temporary insanity</u>. David was employed for this purpose. See I Samuel 16:14-18.
- 2. <u>Later, David was appointed by Saul to be one of his armourbearers</u>. Notice I Samuel 16:19-23.
- 3. David won the battle with Goliath.
- 4. This victory won for him the friend of his lifetime, Jonathan. Consider I Samuel 18:1.
- 5. The attention which David received after this victory stirred the jealousy of Saul. Review Samuel 18:6-9.

- 6. Saul endeavored to slay David with his spear. See I Samuel 18:10, 11.
- 7. Failing in this, Saul reduced David in military rank and power. Read I Samuel 18:13.
- 8. Then Saul gave his daughter to someone else as a wife, though he had promised her to David as a wife. Notice I Samuel 18:17-19.
- 9. After the death of Saul, David became a wise king of Israel.
- 10. <u>David was a man after God's own heart</u>. Review I Samuel 13:14.
- 11. He generally did that which was right in the eyes of the Lord. Study I Kings 15:5.
- 12. He "served his own generation by the will of God." See Acts 13:36.
- 13. He was an important link in the chain of the coming Messiah. Read Matthew 22:41-45.

#### III. <u>DAVID'S SINS</u>.

- 1. The sin of idleness.
- 2. The sin of adultery.
- 3. The sin of murder.
- 4. The sin of deceit.
- 5. <u>David repented of his sins</u>. Read his penitent words in Psalm 51.
- IV. <u>DAVID'S HEARTBREAKS</u>. The child born to Bath-sheba died. David's son assaulted David's daughter. David's son, Absalom, set out to kill Amnon, the attacker, and Absalom fought a war of rebellion against his father's kingdom. Absalom died in this war. David's other son, Solomon, was miserable, having wasted most of his life in things that were vanity.

## IV. <u>DAVID'S DEATH</u>.

- 1. He reigned for  $40\frac{1}{2}$  years.
- 2. He died at the age of 71.
